### **Prescribed Burn Planned for Monterey County**

**Big Sur, CA** – CAL FIRE plans to conduct a prescribed burn at Andrew Molera State Park in Monterey County in the Big Sur area on October 4<sup>th</sup> or October 5<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The project aims to restore the Coastal Prairie Plant Community in Andrew Molera State Park that has diminished due to competition from non-native grasses, encroachment by scrub, and lack of frequent, low intensity fires. The reintroduction of fire to the landscape also has the potential to enhance fire safety by reducing high fuel density.

Each operation follows a specialized burn plan, which considers temperature, humidity, wind, moisture of the vegetation, and conditions for dispersal of smoke. All this information is used to decide when and where to burn.

Smoke from prescribed fire operations is normal and may continue for several days after an ignition depending on the project size, conditions, and weather. Prescribed fire smoke is generally less intense and of much shorter duration than smoke produced by wildland fires.

Smoke from this control burn will be visible from the Big Sur Area, Point Sur, and Pfeiffer State Parks. Expect temporary delays along Highway 1 in area of Andrew Molera State Park. Weather conditions will be monitored, and the burn may be postponed if burning conditions are found to be unfavorable. CAL FIRE is in close consultation with the National Weather Service's Monterey office and Monterey Bay Air Resources District to ensure that burn takes place in appropriate weather conditions.
