## EPA STRENTHENS AIR POLLUTION STANDARDS

For the first time in over a decade, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued a final rule imposing tighter restrictions on fine particulate matter (PM2.5). PM2.5 is a form of pollution from fine particles in air that are 2.5 micrometers (about one ten-thousandth of an inch, approximately 30 times smaller than the width of a human hair) or less in diameter. PM2.5 is typically made up of organic chemicals, dust, soot, and metals. These particles can come from cars and trucks, factories, wood burning, and other activities. (continued .....)
