22. REPORT FROM AIR POLLUTION CONTROL OFFICER
Richard Stedman, APCO, reported on the following:
Advisory Committee
The Advisory Committee did not meet this month since we could not muster a quorum.

Engineering and Compliance

- We are excited to announce that Michael Hamaguchi has been hired to fill our open inspector position. Michael comes to us with over 16 years of experience working as an Inspector and Supervisor at the San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District. His expertise with SJVAPCD covers diverse work duties from Complaint Response, Source Testing, Open Burning, Grant Inspections, to Writing Policies and Procedures. Michael has a B.S. in Neurobiology, Physiology, and Behavior from UC Davis.
- We continue participating in weekly meetings with the County of Monterey about air quality related to the Moss Landing Battery Fire. We received an asbestos notification that work will start to abate asbestos-containing materials outside the burned building this week.
- Our Hearing Board has two upcoming meetings, and we are happy to have two alternate public members for Board approval today. [We still seek members to fill the vacant registered engineer and medical professional positions.](#)

Planning and Air Monitoring

- MBARD received twenty industrial size air purifiers through a grant from CAPCOA last year to establish Clean Air Centers in preparation of potential smoke impacts from wildfires. MBARD is working with Breathe California to distribute the air purifiers. The County of San Benito Office of Emergency Services recently received six of the units. Breathe CA staff are working with Monterey and Santa Cruz Counties to distribute the rest.
- A new, publicly available EV Fast Charge station has been installed in Salinas at 1463 Davis Road, near Walmart. The installation of four 180 kw chargers with two connectors each was funded with a \$176,802 Moyer State Reserve grant. The station is expected to be open for charging later this month.
- The [Landscape Equipment Exchange Program](#) incentivizes residents and commercial operations to replace old, internal combustion landscape equipment with new, cordless zero-emission equipment. So far, 237 residential and 47 commercial applications have been processed, with \$303,000 requested out of \$395,000 in project funds.
- The [Woodstove Change Out Program](#), which offers incentives to replace non-EPA-certified wood stoves, fireplace inserts, and open-hearth fireplaces with cleaner home heating devices, is just about closed. 100% of the \$551,000 in designated funding has been obligated. In January, MBARD received an additional \$73,071 in wood smoke

program funds leftover from Ventura County's program. MBARD's program will close once these funds are exhausted.

- The Monterey Bay Electric Vehicle Incentive Program, which incentivizes residents to purchase new and used all-electric or plug-in electric vehicles, is now closed. \$450,000 was budgeted for the program using funds from local DMV fees.
- As part of the Air Monitoring Division's efforts to continuously improve and upgrade equipment, the air monitoring data server used for storing and distributing air monitoring station data has transitioned to a cloud-based server. This project, funded by a grant through the Inflation Reduction Act, requires less maintenance and improves the reliability of the data being sent to the EPA, which is also published on MBARD's website.

Proposed Fee Rule Revisions

- Proposed fee increase of 2.8%
- Rule 300
 - Add a new source specific fee category for composting
 - Clarify the expired permit timeline
- Rule 301
 - Clarify Schedule 1 is Hourly Staff Rate
 - Revise Public Notification to include website posting
- Rule 309 clarifications consistent with Hearing Board Regulation VI

Language (Rule 300)

5.1.6 If, in the case of a failure to pay Rule 217 revision fees (Section 5.1.4), or Annual Renewal Fees (Part 4), the delinquent Annual Renewal Fee plus penalties assessed pursuant to Section 5.1.4 are not submitted within 120 days of the issuance date of MBARD's billing statement, any affected Permit to Operate or Authority to Construct shall automatically expire and that further operation of the subject equipment without a valid permit is prohibited.

5.1.6.1 Within 30 days of the expiration date, an affected permit may be reinstated by payment to MBARD of the Annual Renewal Fee and all penalties that are owed to MBARD.

5.1.6.2 After 30 days from the expiration date, to determine the person whose permit has expired must apply for a new permit and pay the permit fee for that jurisdiction. The original Annual Renewal Fee and all penalties shall be reinstated along with any permit fee from that jurisdiction.

5.1.6.3 Reinstatement of an expired permit shall not have MBARD a right to enforce any other penalty provided by law for nonpayment during the time that the permit was expired.

New Category (Rule 300/301)

4.3 Renewal Procedure, Source Specific Categories

MBARD will assess an Annual Renewal Fee for each permit issued in the following source categories as set forth in Rule 301, Table 1 Annual Renewal Fee for Source Specific Categories.

- Compost Operations (Wastewater, Sludge, Filter Annual Permit Fees by Volume or weight method)
 - Material Throughput < 20,000 tons per day
 - Material Throughput > 20,000 tons per day < 100,000 tons per day
 - Material Throughput > 100,000 tons per day
- Dry Climate
- Emergency Diesel Fueled Internal Combustion Engine (permit fee code 302)
- Emergency Diesel Fueled Internal Combustion Engine (permit fee code 501)
- Emergency Non-Diesel Fueled Internal Combustion Engine

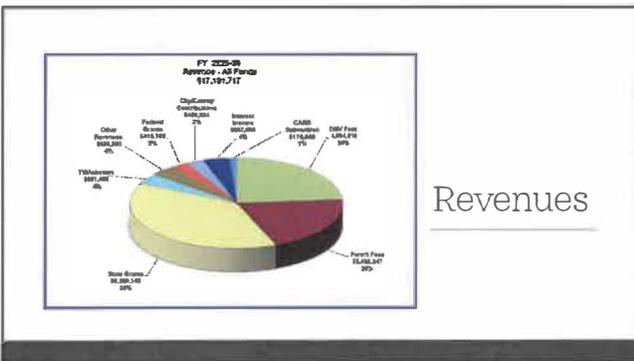

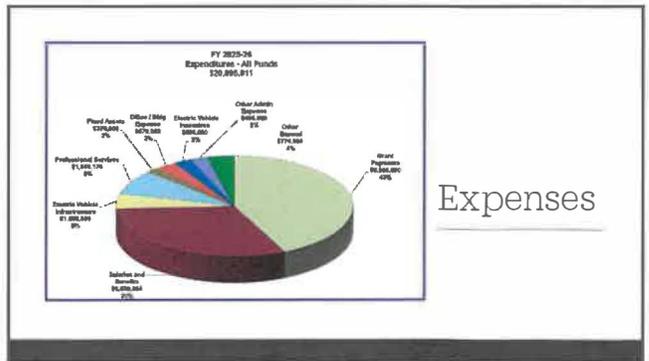

Operating Budget

- Total Operating Budget of \$9.7 million
- Proposed 2.8% increase to permit fees estimated increase of \$72K
- Proposed increase to City and County per capita fees from \$.55 to \$.60. Total estimated increase of \$38K
- Salaries and benefits increase of about 5.3% over FY24-25 budget due to 2.8% pay increase, step increases, 1 additional FTE's, increase in retirement and health benefit rates
- Projected operating deficit of \$527K



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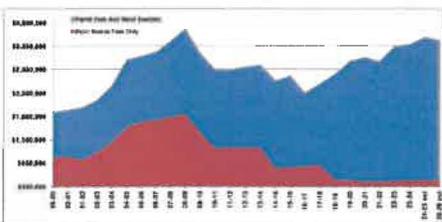

Non-Operating Budget

Total Non-Operating Budget of \$11.2 million, which includes grant funding, electric vehicle (EV) infrastructure and other non-operating expenditures. This is a 22% decrease from the prior year due to multi-year grants.

Major Grant Program Expenditures:

- AB2766 Program - \$1.9 million for grants & \$500,000 for electric vehicle incentives
- AB923 Program - \$2 million in grants & \$1 million for EV Infrastructure Project
- Carl Moyer Program - \$2 million for ag and marine vessel engines
- Offsite Mitigation Grants @ Zero Emission Bus Program (CCCE) - \$150,000 for ag pumps and school buses. The CCCE program will be funded directly through CCCE
- Woodstove Change-out Grants - \$100,000 funded with Clean Air Fund monies
- Community Air Protection Program (CAPP) - \$2 million to reduce air pollution in disadvantaged and low-income areas
- Funding Agricultural Replacement Measures for Emission Reductions (FARMER) - \$818K for replacements of farm equipment, irrigation pumps and heavy-duty trucks
- OPEB and Pension Trust deposits - \$553,000

California Assembly Bill 2766 (AB 2766)

- Signed into law in 1990.
- Projects have reduced air pollution from vehicles for 35 years.
- \$4.00 per DMV vehicle registration in tri-county area.
- Allocations based on county populations and emission sources

Clean Vehicle Program (CVP)



- Public agencies only
- Purchased or leased medium and heavy-duty ZE vehicles
- The max award is \$200,000
 - Medium-duty and heavy-duty means greater than 10,000 lbs

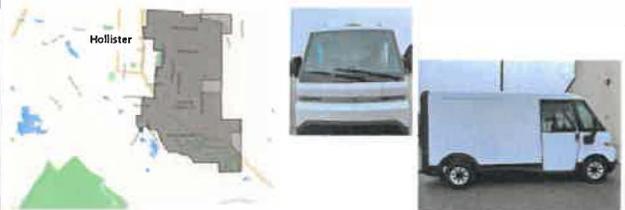

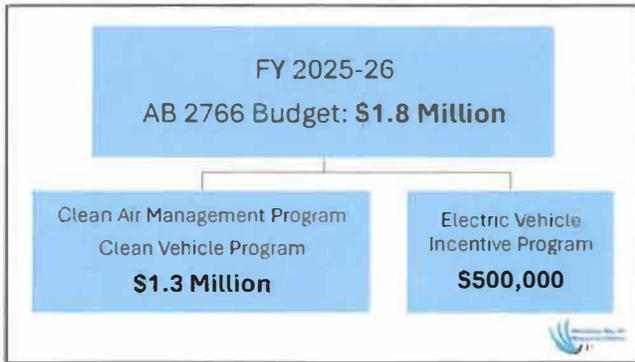

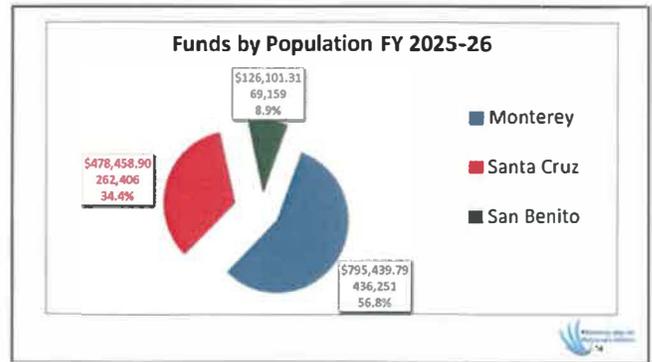
