ORDER DENYING REGULAR VARIANCE

INTRODUCTION

On February 1, 2023, Petitioner, Pellucere Technologies, Inc.

(hereinafter referred to as "Petitioner") filed with this Hearing Board an application for a Regular (Long Term) Variance.

Petitioner requested that the Hearing Board grant a variance from the Monterey Bay Air Resources District's (MBARD) Rule 426 Architectural

Coatings, Section 7.4 which limits the use of photovoltaic coatings to 27 gallons per day. Petitioner requests to apply up to 63.2 gallons per day of a photovoltaic coating.

NOTICE OF HEARING

Notice of the application and the hearing of March 10, 2023 at 2:00 p.m. have been given pursuant to the provisions of the California Health and Safety Code Section 40826. The request and MBARD staff recommendations were presented to the Hearing Board. MBARD was represented by Amy Clymo, Engineer and Compliance Manager, and Mary Giraudo, Supervising Air Quality Engineer. The petitioner was represented by Marc Van Patten, SVP, Pellucere.

BACKGROUND

Pellucere Technologies, Inc. ("Petitioner") is in the business of providing coating services to solar generating plants. The project is to apply a thin silica coating to existing solar modules to help recover some of the solar module degraded performance and provide an anti-soiling property

that will also help the performance of the modules and possibly reduce or eliminate the need for washing the modules in the future.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Hearing Board finds pursuant to Health and Safety Code 42352 that:

Based on Petitioner's testimony, compliance with Rule 426 Architectural Coatings, Section 7.4, which limits the use of photovoltaic coatings to 27 gallons per day, would not result in an arbitrary or unreasonable taking of property or the practical closing and elimination of a lawful business for reasons that are beyond the Petitioner's reasonable control and that a finding pursuant to Section 42352(a)(2) cannot be made to support the issuance of a variance. Petitioner desired to exceed the daily limits while working at California Flats Solar in Parkfield, CA. That business is in operation as originally designed and will continue to be able to do so. Petitioner is not yet in contract with California Flats Solar, and cost impact estimates are preliminary and speculative. Petitioner's coating project is able to proceed while abiding by the daily limits as per Rule 426, although their timeline will have to be extended.
